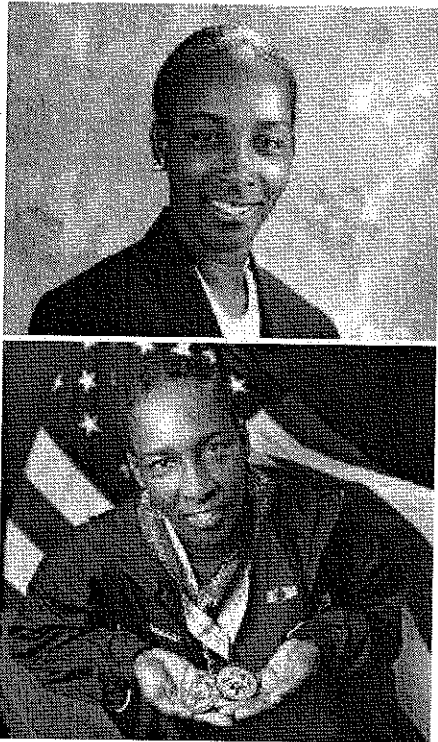

Distinguished Special Olympics Guest at the 164th Annual Grand Banquet

We are extremely pleased and honored to have Ms. Loretta Claiborne join us at our 164th Annual Grand Banquet to share a keynote presentation with us.



Loretta Claiborne, Special Olympics Athlete
Age: 53 Hometown: York, Pennsylvania
Sports: Athletics, Golf, Figure Skating, Tennis, Skiing, Basketball and Soccer

One of the most celebrated Special Olympic athletes, Loretta Claiborne has dedicated her life to showing that persons with developmental disabilities are uniquely talented but too often overlooked and ignored. Despite being born partially blind, mildly retarded, and unable to walk or talk until age 4, she eventually untapped tremendous athletic and public speaking talents which she used to overcome adversity to become a world-class, award-winning Special Olympic athlete and motivational speaker.

In her career, Ms. Claiborne has crossed the finish line of 26 marathons, twice placing among the top 100 women in the Boston Marathon. A competitor in seven International Special Olympics World Games in three different sports (distance running, bowling and figure skating); Ms. Claiborne received the 1996 ESPY Arthur Ashe Award for Courage from ESPN. She is inducted into the Women in Sports Hall of Fame, Special Olympics Pennsylvania and International Hall of Fame among other notable honors.

Beyond her athletic and public speaking accomplishments, Ms. Claiborne holds a black belt in karate; is able to converse in four languages; is fluent in sign language; and has been conferred honorary doctorate degrees in Humane Letters from both Quinnipiac University and Villanova University. She is the title subject of a Disney movie originally broadcast on ABC-TV (now available on video for classroom use) and has made guest appearances on the Oprah Winfrey Show.

Claiborne's life was the basis for a *Wonderful World of Disney* docudrama called *The Loretta Claiborne Story*. The movie tells the story of her life, being born with an intellectual disability as well as physical challenges, and of her overcoming enormous odds to become an accomplished athlete and spokesperson. The movie has aired numerous times in the United States, in many countries around the world, and is a teaching tool in the Special Olympics "Get Into It!" K-12 service learning curriculum.

And now, Ms. Claiborne's uplifting life story is chronicled in the text, *In Her Stride*, one of the featured titles in the new World Scapes literacy series for grades 3-6. This series includes as other examples of role models to learn from: Sir Edmund Hillary, Cathy Freeman, Nelson Mandela and Mother Theresa. Recently, Claiborne delivered the opening remarks to those in attendance at the funeral of Founder of Special Olympics, Eunice Kennedy Shriver. Claiborne's inspirational story reminds us that we can overcome seemingly insurmountable odds through personal triumph. She is truly the embodiment of today's Special Olympics athlete.
